### Club Exhibits

There will be a club exhibit from February 20 to February 25 at the brand-spanking-new Erlanger library branch located off Dixie Highway, south of I-275. There is room for each person to have at least four to six prints. The exhibit may need to be installed during the day on February 20; if so, and you cannot participate in the installation, you will need to bring your prints to the February 7 meeting to deliver to Dale Voelker. Dale will investigate the possibility of installing the exhibit on Wednesday night, and of leaving the exhibit up past the 25<sup>th</sup>.

There is an ongoing exhibit at Caesar Creek Park where you can sell your prints; the Park charges a 20 percent commission. You should contact the Ranger at Caesar Creek Park for additional information. There may still be room available for additional prints.

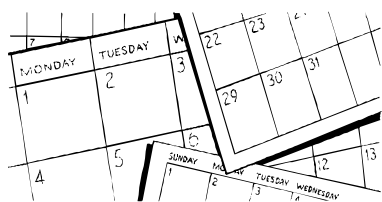
**2003 Field Trips**

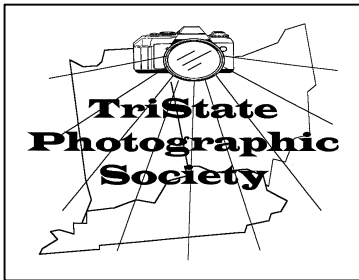
