I think we figured TriState took home 20% of the wins. It was a great weekend with terrific shooting weather, with just a little rain on Friday.

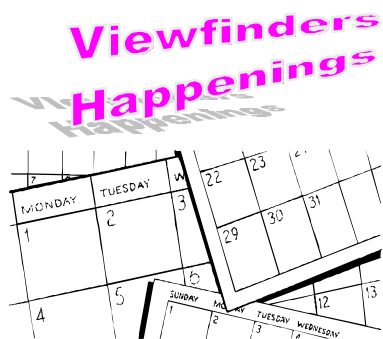
Next year, Bob Ihrig & John Szabo will be shooting with a patch over one eye and one hand tied behind their backs!

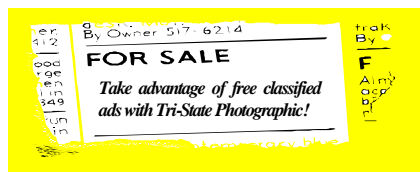
