

What are the Primary Colors?

I had a recent discussion regarding Primary Colors that asked “What are the Primary Colors?” The artist side of me said “Red, Blue & Yellow.” However, the part of me involved with computer monitors said, “Red, Blue & Green.” But wait a minute, my printer uses Cyan, Magenta & Yellow! So what is it?

Well, the answer is not so straight forward as a yes or no. The answer is: “It depends.”

Turns out there are two sets of primary colors. It depends on how you are combining the colors and what medium you are using to *portray/see* the color.

One primary color set is the *additive* set such as the colors on your monitor that combine the colors Red, Green and Blue. The monitor projects overlapping (adding) light on your screen.

The second primary color set is the *subtractive* set such as the mixing of pigments or dyes used in printers and by artists. However, while the printer uses Cyan, Magenta & Yellow, along with black, the artist uses Blue, Red & Yellow.

What does this mean to the photographer? Most of these designations are human based concepts developed to help us understand color relationships. If you consider the color wheel (*subtractive*), the *primary* colors of Red, Blue & Yellow are used to

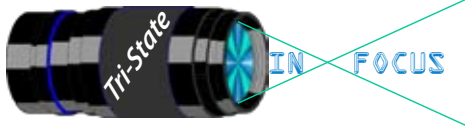
make the *secondary* colors of Orange, Green and Purple. What we are looking for is harmony and/or contrast of color in the image. The color wheel can help us see that. One side of the wheel is warm (yellow, orange & red) while the other side is cool (violet, blue & green). Side by side colors on the wheel can be harmonious such as blue & green.

Opposite colors on the wheel are known as complimentary colors and can provide contrast such as the photograph on this page. When you look at this image, you see the red fire hydrant and the yellow flowers - opposites. You also see the green grass. But why does my eye always go to a tiny blue flower that is a single small color in the mist of other colors. Would this be a primary color set? I’m not sure! And I still don’t know the answer to “What are the Primary Colors?”

Interesting side note: In the human eye full of rods & cones, the rods do not see color, 64% of the cones see red, 32% see green and 2% see blue. Of the three types of cones, blue is the most sensitive.

Confused? So am I!

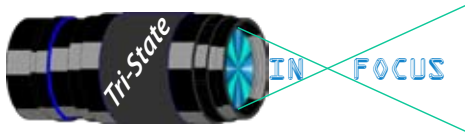

presentations and questions are always welcome. Adam is known for his practical nuts and bolts approach to solving problems in the field and enjoys sharing his expertise with others.

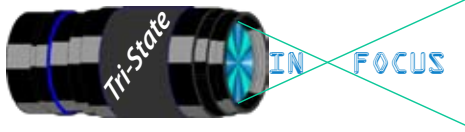

and modify the longest side (height or width) to 750. The other dimension should automatically adjust.

If you don't know how to adjust the size, or can't, feel free to email the image to Jerry. He will adjust the size. For best color results, your JPEG image should also use a sRGB color profile.
