

It Pays To Keep Your Eyes Open!

I was in the Western Mountains of North Carolina near Henderson with Chet King and wives to primarily help Chet to understand how to see and photograph waterfalls and rapidly moving water. On the first day we were traveling along US 64 in the Cullasaja Gorge when we stopped at a small turn-out to check some rapids. After a brief trip down a steep trail to the water's edge, we set-up to begin shooting some small rapids and boulders. Chet got right into it getting the whole scene as well as picking some smaller sections to zoom in on. We were there about an hour and a half when I got a brief flash of pink about 15 yards away as I scanned the bank area above the signs of recent flooding.

Upon moving closer I noticed a small nodding trillium with a pink flower hanging below the main leaves. I thought at first that this may be a white trillium that was near the end of its life as they sometimes turn slightly pink as they age. I then noticed that there were up to ten trilliums with in a

five yard area and that a few had not yet opened. The flowers were about six inches tall with the bloom between the size of a quarter and a half dollar. I showed Chet these flowers and commented that we would come back and just spend time photographing them. When then packed up and continued on our search for rapids and water falls.

Three days later, it rained heavily for part of the morning and Chet and I were not able to get back to the trilliums because of wife commitments. I had told my wife about these pretty pink flowers and she suggested that we go and see if we could get in there and get a few photos. We went to the spot where I was able to capture these beautiful flowers.

I used a 70-200 F 2.8 lens at F-4 with a Canon 500D close-up lens at 1/125 sec. shutter speed.





Places to Go To View & Photograph Wildlife - Spring

Places to go to view and photograph wild life during the Spring. Thank you to Paul Ice, Jerry Fritsch and Richard Jones for this information.

Magee Marsh (Ohio) State Park is the best place to see large numbers of warblers, and other song birds, that migrate north around Mother's Day.

A lot of bird and butterfly photography can be done April-June at *Eastfork (Ohio) State Park*, as well as *Ault Park (Cincinnati)* and *Winton Woods, Sharon Woods* and *Miami Whitewater (Hamilton Co)* parks. If you take seed, *Sharon Woods* has a bird blind. You can use *Cincinnati Nature Center* to shoot frogs, butterflies and birds. *Oxbow*, by Lawerenceburg, IN, is a great place for herons and other waterfowl.

Fernald (OH)Wetlands is a good place for swans, ducks, hawks and butterflies. While there are public paths in the Fernald wetlands, here's a hint, contact them ahead of time and ask for a naturalist/guide. If you do this, you may be able to go on paths not generally open to the public. At Fernald, be prepared to hike a bit carrying your gear.



Observing and/or Photographing the Heavens

The Night Sky in May 2011

May 1st: The "Morning Star" stands to the right of the Moon before sunrise. Look for dimmer Mercury to the lower left of Venus.

May 10^{th and} 11th: Besides the 10th's being the day the Japanese began to surrender in 1945 because they found out I had joined the Navy and was coming after them, you can look for Venus and Jupiter "standing" side by side at first light. The brighter one is Venus. Venus is so bright -- and has always been - the Navy even attempted to "shoot it down" during WW II. Why would the Navy do that? It looked like an unidentified man-made light in the sky. Fortunately the Navy never did, though; so it's still there for us to enjoy. Venus looks so beautiful, the ancient Greeks named it for the Goddess of Love. Just as love can look deceivingly beautiful in many other ways, Venus is the worst. If you'd go there, you'd melt in the sulfuric acid clouds that surround it. I urge you not to go. Oh yes, Jupiter is the other bright spot there.

May 13th: Look for Saturn to the left of the Moon at nightfall. Titan, the moon of Jupiter, is the largest one in our universe. It is even larger than the planet Mercury. It would take 831 Earths to fill a hollow Saturn. Hey, it's big, but not so big as Jupiter. It would take 1000 earths to fill a hollow Jupiter. If you like metaphors, another way to look at it is to consider the earth's becoming a marble; then consider Jupiter to be a grapefruit.

May 14th: Spica is the bright star to the left of the Moon; Saturn is above them.

May 29/30th: Jupiter rises to the upper left of the Moon in the early hours of the morning on the 29th and to its upper right on the 30th. Yes, Jupiter appears to be a brilliant star.







If you would like to participate in the **Pr**ojected **D**igital **I**mages competitions you can email them to Jerry at jafritsch01@yahoo.com up through the Thursday before each Friday meeting. They should be JPEG format (.JPG file type) with the longest side having 750 pixels or less.

You can re-size the images in your digital processing software, usually under Image, then Image Size. Change the scale to pixels (not inches or cm),

and modify the longest side (height or width) to 750. The other dimension should automatically adjust.

If you don't know how to adjust the size, or can't, feel free to email the image to Jerry. He will adjust the size. For best color results, your JPEG image should also use a sRGB color profile.

Please include your name, the image title, and if you are competing in Tyro or Advanced categories in the e-mail.
